

There are two environments for quotations: `quote` and `quotation`. `quote` is used either for a short quotation or for a sequence of short quotations separated by blank lines:

```
US presidents ... pithy remarks:
\begin{quote}
The buck stops here.

I am not a crook.
\end{quote}
```

```
US presidents have been known for their pithy
remarks:
    The buck stops here.
    I am not a crook.
```

Use the `quotation` environment for quotations that consist of more than one paragraph. Paragraphs in the input are separated by blank lines as usual:

```
Here is some advice to remember:
\begin{quotation}
Environments for making
...other things as well.

Many problems
...environments.
\end{quotation}
```

```
Here is some advice to remember:
    Environments for making quo-
tations can be used for other things
as well.
    Many problems can be solved by
novel applications of existing envi-
ronments.
```
